

- 1. Photos of interred person (s) are permitted on the monument.
- 2. All monuments must bear first and last name of plot owner and an inscribed cross of 4 inches or larger. Additional Christian symbols may also be inscribed.
- 3. Monument material must be of durable goods made of traditional marble or granite; however, material of fiberglass and bronze will be allowed.
- 4. Only one above ground marker or monument will be allowed on each burial site. One large monument will be allowed to mark two or more graves. If additional grave markers are desired, the additional marker must be a surface marker at grade level in monument line.
- 5. All above ground markers shall be on a foundation with a minimum of a four (4") mowing edge of concrete. We recommend additional length be added to foundation for flower placement, not to exceed the maximum length.
  - a. A single grave foundation, minimum 24" wide and up to maximum 42" long.
  - b. A double grave foundation, minimum 24" wide and up to maximum 88" long.
  - c. A triple grave foundation, minimum 24" wide and up to maximum 108" long.
  - d. A quad grave foundation, minimum 24" wide and up to maximum 120" long.
  - e. The maximum length of a monument on a triple or quad foundation is 100".
- 6. No monument can be **<u>NO MORE</u>** than 48" in height above monument foundation.
- 7. Before a monument is set in the cemetery, the pastor receives two copies of a draft from the monument company. After he checks them, he then sends them to the cemetery sexton to be approved. One will then be returned to the monument company, and one filed at the parish office.
- 8. No permit for a marker or monument will be issued by the Cemetery Association until all payments due to the Cemetery Association have been paid. There will be a fee of \$150.00 for each time staking is requested for setting the monument.
- 9. Infant graves: Overall in-ground memorial unit size, including a 2" concrete edge, 14"x24" as measured from left to right (14") and front to rear (24"), no more, no less. No above ground memorial allowed in infant section.
- 10. Monuments and markers belong to lot owners, though the Cemetery does have the obligation to observe reasonable care while working around the stones. The Cemetery disclaims responsibility for any damage to markers or monuments done by persons other than employees. Should damage be from outright vandalism, by act of God, war, riots or insurrection, the homeowner's insurance of the lot owner should cover repair or replacement costs, subject to policy deductible.
- 11. Should any marker or monument become unsightly, dilapidated or a menace, the Cemetery Association shall have the right to repair or remove same. Any costs involved shall be at the expense of the lot owner or heir.
